1.2 Primary and Secondary Club Designation for Players

PLAYER CLUB ASSOCIATION

The primary/secondary club association of members is designed to foster greater competition in games, and offer higher level playing experience for players in the lower divisions.

- 1.2.1 A player may designate one club as a primary club and one club as a secondary club for both T20 and 40-over competitions.
- 1.2.2 Anyone who has NOT played any international match, or any limited overs match at State, County or Provincial level in a Full Member country, or franchise based teams/competitions at State, County or Provincial level recognized by the National Cricket Governing Body of a Full Member country, can choose any club from any division as their primary or secondary club.
- 1.2.3 In the interest of fair play, anyone who has played any international match for any country, or any limited overs match at State, County or Provincial level in a Full Member country, or franchise based teams/competitions at State, County or Provincial level recognized by the National Cricket Governing Body of a Full Member country, in the past 10 years, is not entitled to be part of the playing eleven of a Division II or Division III club.
- 1.2.4 The primary and the secondary club for any player cannot be from the same division.
- 1.2.5 The secondary club selected by the player can only be one level lower than the primary club e.g. if the primary club is in Premier Division, the player can only select a Division I team as secondary club. There is no similar restriction on choosing a secondary club that is in a higher division e.g. if the primary club is in Division III, the player can select a club from either Division II or Division I or Premier Division, as his/her secondary club.
- 1.2.6 The player transfer rules, deadlines as well as the player transfer fees for the T20 and the 40-over competition shall apply for both primary and secondary clubs.
- 1.2.7 A player cannot play for his/her secondary club if the primary club has a game on the same date.
- 1.2.8 No more than 2 secondary players can play in the playing XI of a team in any game.
- 1.2.9 The primary and secondary club designation is only applicable for the regular divisions namely Premier Division, Division I, Division II, and Division III. It is not applicable for other WCL Competitions such as 50-Over Competition, Fall T20 Competition, or any other cross-divisional competitions organized by the WCL.
